## Rules and Policies

### MEMBERSHIP

The Tamarack Women's Golf Association is composed of two groups, the 18 Holers and the 9 Holers.

The qualifications for membership in this association are given in the Bylaws which appear at the end of this book. Contact a member of the Women's Board or the Bylaws Committee if additional information or clarification is needed.

### BYLAWS COMMITTEE

**Jo Ann Sacco** – Chairperson

In order to compete for points and/or prizes, a woman must be a paid member in good standing.

### POLICY CLARIFICATION:

#### PRIVILEGES AND RESTRICTION FOR SPECIAL MEMBERSHIPS

- A. Members on Leave of Absence are still members and cannot be considered guests. They are not permitted to play as guests for regular play or events.
- B. Honorary Members may join the Ladies Golf Association and participate in any and all club events.
- C. Non-Resident Members are permitted to play fourteen (14) rounds (husband and wife) during golf year. They are permitted to join the Ladies Golf Association or play in any club event.

### DUES

Annual dues are \$150. Dues will be billed directly through the Club unless other arrangements are made with the Treasurer. Fees for the Metropolitan Handicap Service and Hole-In-One fund are automatically billed through the Club. New members will contribute \$5 to the Hole-in-One Fund upon joining. When the Hole-in-One Fund balance drops below \$250, all current members will be billed to replenish the fund. Monies received from dues are used for year-end prizes, weekly points and miscellaneous expenses as the Women's Board deems necessary. After June 15th no refunds will be given.

### TOURNAMENTS

18 Holer tournaments are played on Wednesdays. The tee is reserved until 11:30am if the field is playing with assigned tee times off the front and back. If a shotgun has been scheduled, the course will be closed for the duration of play. However, if any players exceed 4 hours and 15 min for any given tournament, afternoon play will commence at the discretion of the Pro Shop.

A tournament officially begins when the first foursome on the front and/or back has teed off, or in the case of the shotgun, when the field begins play at the designated time.

Class points will be determined on a weekly basis by the Tournament Chairperson.





## Rules and Policies (continued)

Each member will be put into class according to USGA handicap (see Handicap section). In the event of an extended tournament, not including the President's Cup, the player will remain in the original class but will be allotted the current number of shots.

In order to be eligible for tournament competition, a player must submit a score card that has been dated, signed and attested by another member of her foursome. Cards should be signed only if the signer and the attester agree with the totals.

Points will be awarded for Low Gross and First, Second and Third Low Net and fewest putts. Points will also be given for Sandies. Equal points will be given for ties unless otherwise stipulated. Only players who have submitted valid scores will be eligible for points.

In addition to points, prizes will be awarded at the end of the season for the following:

**Ringers** – Low Gross in each class  
Low Net in each class

**Birdies** – Winner and Runner-up  
Ties will be honored

### **MOST IMPROVED GOLFER AWARD**

Calculations are made from April 1st to the current October 1st. The candidate must play a minimum of 7 rounds with the 18 Holers on Wednesdays.

Breaking 100, 90, 80 for the first time at Tamarack for 18 holers.

Breaking 60 or 50 for the first time at Tamarack for 9 holers.

Cumulative Point Awards

All Major Tournament prizes

### **SIGN-UP AND CANCELLATIONS**

Sign-up and Cancellations may be done through Foretees system or by calling the Pro Shop by Tuesday evening. If you know in advance that you are unable to play and have already been assigned a foursome, please call the Pro Shop. If you must cancel the night before or the morning of play, please cancel on-line or call the Pro Shop. Please call the Pro Shop if there is any doubt about the tournament being played that day.

A tournament may be suspended by the Pro, Greenskeeper or Tournament Committee in the event of lightning, deluge or course conditions making continuance of play impossible.

### **RULES**

U.S.G.A. Rules govern all play. It would be beneficial to become reacquainted with the rules and etiquette of golf each year. A copy of the rule book should be kept in your golf bag at all times. If any controversy arises over the application of the rules of golf, players should see a member of the Pro Shop before posting their scores. In the case of Match Play, the dispute should be settled before teeing off on the next hole.

### **RINGERS, BIRDIES AND SANDIES**

Ringers may be posted anytime a member plays a round of golf provided that:

1. She plays with another member, (18 or 9 Holer of the TWGA)
2. She plays enough holes (13 or more) to post an 18 hole score.
3. She posts her score



## Rules and Policies (continued)

Ringers can only be posted for holes when the ball is “holed out” – putts that are given by a competitor or holes where a score has been calculated using a player’s handicap are not eligible for ringers.

To be eligible for chip-ins on Wednesdays, you need to donate \$1 to the jar for final winnings. In events sponsored by TWGA, such as Guest Days and Mixed Member Guest Days, Ringers may also be posted even if not playing in a foursome with another member – but the score must be posted and at least 13 holes must be played.

Be sure to post your score on the ringer board and adjust your ringers using the honor system. Post your birdies and sandies on the bulletin board.

### HOLE IN ONE

\$250 from the Hole-In-One Fund will be paid to the member of the Women’s Golf Association who has a hole-in-one at Tamarack during the golf season (defined as from the first official day of play through the last official day of play) provided that:

- A. She has completed 13 holes of play and posts an 18 hole score in accordance with U.S.G.A. rules  
-and-
- B. She is playing with another member of the association or is playing in an event sponsored by the association.

### ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL GUEST DAY EVENTS

Any guest (male or female) without an official U.S.G.A. handicap may compete for gross prizes only.

### LADIES GUEST DAYS

There will be a fee per foursome which will be billed directly to your account. No more than two (2) regular members of Tamarack may participate in the same foursome. Members of Tamarack who do not belong to the Association may not participate.

### WEEKEND GOLF

Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays: For information on how to reserve tee times, consult with a member of the professional staff or log onto the website and click on Tee Times.

### JUNIOR GOLF

Junior golfers are under the auspices of the Men’s Golf Committee.

### DRESS CODE

Proper attire is required at all times. Please consult the Tamarack Country Club Membership Book for detailed information. Members are expected to inform their guests of the dress code prior to their arrival at the Club.



## Rules and Policies (continued)

### LADIES LOCKER ROOM

The Ladies Locker Room is for the use of Tamarack Country Club members and their guests only. Bathing suits are not permitted in the club house. Minors under 16 are not permitted in the ladies locker room.

### HANDICAPS

The Women's Board has approved the use of U.S.G.A. Handicaps for all events at Tamarack.

A new member with the established handicap is eligible to enter weekly competition provided she presents her U.S.G.A. handicap card. If there is no card, a temporary handicap can be established by submitting five (5) complete scores. All cards must be signed, dated and attested.

### ALL SCORES MUST BE POSTED!

If you elect to pick up your ball at any time during the competition and, therefore disqualify yourself, you must indicate a NO CARD (NC) on your score card. You must also hand in a NO CARD to the Pro Shop.

If you hand in a NO CARD, you must not submit any ringers, birdies, chip-ins or sandies for the day. **AN ADJUSTED SCORE FOR HANDICAP FOR THE DAY MUST BE POSTED.**

According to the U.S.G.A. Handicap System (Section 4). A golfer is ".....required to record a hole score for a hole not finished, not played," and "...to adjust any hole score when it is higher than the maximum number she (he) is allotted to post."

1. Section 4-1: If a player starts but does not complete a hole or has conceded a stroke, she shall record for handicap purposes the score she most likely would have made. This most likely score should be preceded by an "X". Such score shall not exceed her Equitable Stroke Control limit, defined in Section 4-3.
2. Section 4-2: If a player does not play a hole or plays it other than under the Rules of Golf (except for preferred lies), her score for that hole for handicap purposes shall be par plus any handicap strokes she is entitled to receive on the hole. When recording this hole score, precede the score with an "X".
3. Section 4-3: Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap. ESC is used only when a player's actual or most likely score exceeds his maximum number based on the following tables.

## Bylaws

### ARTICLE I

SECTION I. The name of this Association shall be: The Tamarack Women's Golf Association (TWGA).

### ARTICLE II

#### Object

SECTION II. The object of this Association shall be to promote interest in the game of golf among its members, i.e., Eighteen Holers and Nine Holers; to promote good sportsmanship and competitiveness within the rules of golf.

### ARTICLE III

#### Membership

SECTION I. Female members of all golfing classifications shall be eligible for membership in the Tamarack Women's Golf Association with the following stipulations:

- (a) A woman's handicap determines whether or not she is eligible for membership in the 18-Holers. She needs a handicap of 40 or less (35.6 F Index). The Chairman of the Handicap Committee will issue judgment upon verification of said Index.
- (b) Female members of Tamarack who have attained the age of 18.
- (c) Exception: A female golfing member of Tamarack of any age with an 18-Hole Handicap may compete in the Women's Club Championship upon approval of the Handicap Chairman and the Tournament Chairman.

SECTION II. A member of the Tamarack Women's Golf Association must be a member in GOOD STANDING!\*

\*See Tamarack's Handbook "Article IV – Membership, Section 5".

### ARTICLE IV

#### Dues

SECTION I. The dues for membership shall be fixed by the Women's Board on or before the Spring Meeting of the Women's Golf Association.

### ARTICLE V

#### Officers

SECTION I. The Executive Officers of this association shall be the President, the Vice-President, the Secretary and the Treasurer

SECTION II. All Executive Officers shall hold office for one (1) year or until their successors are elected and installed, and shall not be eligible to serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same office.

SECTION III. In case of vacancy in the office of President, the Vice-President shall become the President. Vacancies in other offices shall be filled by a majority vote of the Women's Golf Association.

### ARTICLE VI

#### Nominating and Proxy Committee

SECTION I. At the Spring Meeting of each year a Nominating and Proxy Committee of three (3) regular members of the Association shall be chosen in the following manner: The Women's Board shall elect the Chairperson of the Committee, and the members at large shall elect the second and third members, who must be in attendance or, if absent, shall have given their written consent to the Women's Board. Members of the Committee shall be eligible for nomination.

SECTION II. In September of each year, the Nominating and Proxy Committee shall designate one (1) or more candidates for each office. The committee shall secure the consent of each nominee

before announcing her as a candidate. At least thirty (30) days prior to the Fall Meeting the Committee shall post the names of its nominees.

SECTION III. Any member of the Association wishing to put forth a separate slate or individual candidate for executive office must have consent of each individual proposed, have obtained fifteen (15) signatures, and present this to the Nominating Committee fifteen (15) days before the October election. Members of the Committee shall be eligible for nomination.

SECTION IV. The report of the Nominating and Proxy Committee shall be read at the Fall Meeting.

SECTION V. The Executive Officers shall be elected by a majority vote of members voting in person or by proxy at the close of said Meeting.

### ARTICLE VII

#### Duties of the executive officers

SECTION I. The President shall be the chief officer and shall direct the conduct of the business of the Association; shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of the Women's Board; in the absence of the Treasurer, sign all checks; shall appoint all committees unless provided for in these Bylaws or in the motion authorizing the committee; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.

SECTION II. The Vice-President in the absence of the President shall perform the duties of the President.

SECTION III. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Association and the Women's Board; shall maintain a roll of membership; shall be custodian of the permanent records of the Association.

SECTION IV. The Treasurer shall receive all dues and funds of the Association and shall deposit them in the bank designated by the Women's Board; shall sign all checks; and shall pay authorized bills upon approval signed by the President; and shall be ex-officio a member of the Prize Committee. The books of the Treasurer shall be audited by a committee of two (2) members of the Women's Golf Association appointed by the Women's Board annually.

### ARTICLE VIII

#### Meetings

SECTION I. Semi-annual meetings of the Association shall be held at Tamarack Country Club. There shall be one meeting in the spring and one meeting in the fall of each year on days selected by the Women's Board.

SECTION II. Twenty (20) percent of the Association members in good standing shall constitute a quorum at the meetings. Notice of the Semi-Annual or any special meeting of the Association shall be given to each member.

SECTION III. Notice of the Semi-Annual or any special meeting of the Association shall be given to each member.

### ARTICLE IX

#### Woman's Board

SECTION I. The Women's Board shall consist of not more than eighteen (18) members; President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and the following Committee Chairpersons: Tournament, Handicap, Prizes, Publicity, Ringers, Hospitality, Nine Hole Advisor, Women's Metropolitan Golf Representative, Interclub, Bylaws, Ladies' Guest Days, Special Events.



## Bylaws (continued)

SECTION II. The Women's Board shall meet at the call of the President, or the Vice-President acting in the absence of the President. There shall be a minimum of four (4) meetings during the year. The President shall call the first Women's Board meeting within thirty (30) days after the Fall Meeting and then shall call a meeting of the Women's Board within thirty (30) days prior to the Spring Meeting.

SECTION III. A Majority of the Women's Board shall constitute a quorum.

### ARTICLE X Committees

SECTION I. There shall be such committees as these Bylaws provide, and such other special committees as the Women's Board may authorize.

SECTION II. Each committee shall consist of at least two (2) members and shall be appointed by the President within thirty (30) days after she takes office.

SECTION III. The Tournament Committee shall be responsible to the President for planning and conducting all competitions except team matches; shall select all tournament dates; arrange all schedules of play and events of the year; shall have a schedule printed and a copy available for each member by the opening date. The Chairperson of said committee shall see that a member of the committee is present to conduct each event.

SECTION IV. The Handicap Committee shall be responsible to the President for all aspects of handicapping, and shall compute handicaps for all women golfers of Tamarack Country Club.

SECTION V. The Prize Committee shall be responsible to the President for the purchase and distribution of all prizes. The President shall present a proposed budget for prizes to the Prize Committee at the beginning of the golfing season.

SECTION VI. The Publicity Committee shall have charge of publicity for all ladies golf and social events and shall be responsible for "The Tee Tattler."

SECTION VII. The Ringers Committee shall keep a record of all ringers posted by members during the golfing season.

SECTION VIII. The Hospitality Committee shall be responsible for welcoming all new eighteen (18) holer golfers into the Association. Also, this committee shall be responsible for any cards, flowers, or gifts sent by the Association.

SECTION IX. The Nine Hole Advisor shall be the liaison assisting them in all aspects of this Association.

SECTION X. The Interclub representative shall be in charge of all matters pertaining to participating in events of Interclub Team matches.

SECTION XI. The Women's Metropolitan Golf Association (WMGA) representative shall be in charge of all matters pertaining to participating in events of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association.

SECTION XII. The Ladies' Guest Day Committee shall be responsible for arranging and supervising all Ladies' Guest Day activities.

SECTION XIII. The Special Events Committee shall be responsible for money raising events of the Association, the Board Outing, the Holiday Luncheon and Opening/Welcome Back and Closing luncheon.



**ARTICLE XI**

**Rules**

SECTION I. The regular tournament day of the Association, known as Ladies' Day, shall be held on Wednesday of each week during the golfing season, unless otherwise directed by the Board of Governors of the Tamarack Country Club.

SECTION II. All members of the Women's Golf Association in good standing shall be eligible to compete for prizes.

SECTION III. Tournaments and golfing events of the Association shall be governed by the U.S.G.A. subject to change by a local rules posted by the Tournament Committee.

**ARTICLE XII**

**Amendments**

SECTION I. These Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the regular members of the Association voting in person, electronically or by proxy.

**ARTICLE XIII**

SECTION I. The President must have approval of the Women's Board in order to keep more than \$300.00 in the treasury at the end of each golf season.

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
